

About the Artist:

Barbara Teusink is an award winning artist whose work is represented in private collections across the southeast. A contemporary realist, Barbara's subjects include still life, floral, portrait, figure and landscape. A relative newcomer to the field, Barbara began her artistic studies in November 2012 after retiring from a professional career in educational technology. She continually seeks to improve through diligent self-study, weekly classes and occasional workshops. She strives to capture and preserve the fleeting moments of life; an expression or gesture, the light, the season, or a striking arrangement of objects. Barbara lives in Chapin with her husband, dogs and cat.

Artist Statement/About the Artwork:

One of the most popular and beloved pond fish species, koi have been around for hundreds of years. Watching koi swim can bring a real sense of serenity in a chaotic world. Whether you have a koi fish pond in your backyard or not, this trail marker can bring a sense of that serenity to any space. Koi fish are powerful symbols in feng shui for attracting abundance and prosperity. Native to Asia, koi are symbolic in Japanese culture. Different species stand for different virtues including love, wealth, prosperity, success, and luck. More than 20 types of koi exist, appearing in a wide variety of patterns and color variations. Their average lifespan is 25 to 30 years, but some have lived to over 100 years old. The gold koi is a symbol of creativity and wealth.

When koi fish are represented in pairs, they symbolize a marriage or love relationship filled with happiness and good luck. The circular teardrop shapes inside the yin yang symbol represent two koi, a male and a female, symbolizing the balance of energies. Most auspicious is a grouping of nine koi as are represented on the trail marker post (plus one on each side of the sailboat for extra luck.)
