





Shannon Smith Hughes and Jennifer Smith Rogers, two thirds of the triplet siblings from the Smith Family of Artists in Charleston, SC live and paint in Charleston, SC where they coown Anglin Smith Fine Art gallery with their mother Betty Anglin Smith. Both sisters earned their BFA at Clemson University in the early '90's.

Shannon's oils are known for color, painterly brushwork, and capturing light in simple everyday scenes. While her subject varies from landscape, still life, interiors, to figures it is her use of light that becomes the common thread in her work. Shannon has studied in the US and Europe with renowned artists Kim English, Gregg Kreutz, Kenn Backhaus, and Quang Ho. She is a signature member of Plein Air Painters of the Southeast, and often travels to plein air paint and exhibit with this accomplished group of artists. Shannon has taught plein air painting workshops locally and in Italy. She is also an associate member of Oil Painters of America and American Impressionists Society where she has been juried into their exhibitions and won awards. Her collectors include corporations such as Clemson University Foundation, Piggly Wiggly Corporate Headquarters, Hospice of Charleston, and McCrady's restaurant.

Whether painting landscapes or architecture, Jennifer exaggerates color and uses painterly brushwork to capture a dramatic sense of light, mood, and place. 
Aaron Carree – Benedict Associate Juror


About the CCAL Associate Juror Program



History of the League

Organizing the Art League was initiated in 1994 when a few interested artists got together to paint weekly at Midlands Tech. The idea came to fruition shortly after the group moved to Crooked Creek Park when it opened in 1995. Several of the interested artists met to initiate and finalize the plans for the organization to be called the Crooked Creek Art League. This small band of artists scripted a Constitution and the Crooked Creek Art League was formed. A mission statement was written and is basically the same as the one we promote today: "Encouraging and Stimulating the Practice and Appreciation of Creative Arts". The League met monthly at the Crooked Creek Park in the "Art Room". Jeannie Branham served as the first President and the first meeting of the League was held in September 1995 with 33 members in attendance. The first Juried Show was in the spring of 1996 with the show being held in the Crooked Creek Park gymnasium using pegboard panels to display the art. It is believed that approximately 35 pieces of art were on display and Ilona Royce-Smithkin served as the Juror. The League, in cooperation with the ICRC, brochures, juried shows, educating workshops, gallery participations and word of mouth has seen growth to over 110+ members today. The League has continued to grow since 1995 and we feel very fortunate to have several of the original members of that founding group of artists still active in the League today.
